



Mark Rembert, is a co-founder and director of Energize Clinton County, and serves as consultant to the Commission's various efforts including the City of Wilmington, Green Enterprise Zone (GEZ) and the Buy Local First Clinton County initiative.

Mr. Rembert grew up in Clinton County and is a 2003 graduate of Wilmington High School and a 2007 graduate from Haverford College where he earned a B.A. in economics, completing his major at Bryn Mawr College where he wrote a quantitative thesis on competitive balance in Major League Baseball.
