



Pete Mallow serves as staff consultant related to economic development and Regional Manager for the Cincinnati office of EMH&T responsible for overseeing the preparation and project coordination of an array of development projects for a variety of municipal and private development projects. With more than twelve years of involvement in economic development, he has led the successful acquisition, planning, entitlement, and development of over two million square feet of commercial, industrial, and multi-family properties and over 2,200 homes in 65 communities across Greater Cincinnati and Dayton region.

Most recently Mr. Mallow has been a leader in environmentally friendly economic development in the Cincinnati region. He has overseen the development of over 150,000 square feet of Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified buildings in the south west Ohio region, including one of Cincinnati's first LEED tax abatement projects and the first LEED Platinum project in Ohio.

He is known for his facilitation abilities that make him a valuable team leader, motivating stakeholders from different backgrounds to come together to act as a single entity for the community.
