The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities regularly reviews County Boards of DD to ensure quality services are available throughout our great state. We recently underwent our review here in Clinton County. A team of seven reviewers was on site for two days in July.

They observed our practices, reviewed plans, met with individuals and family members, and talked with staff and board members. Our review went very well. We received no

citations, which is not easy to achieve and very few counties do. This is our second review in a row in which we have received no citations.

- We know our people. We interact with them and have true actual relationships.
- We put families in the driver's seat with their plans.
- Concerns are addressed immediately.
- We want to see people succeed.
- Individuals and families feel supported by the board. We listen and help plan their futures.

## **Early Intervention Facts**

More than 150 children living in Clinton County, ages birth to three years, received early intervention services from July 2022 through June 2023. Services provided by

our County Board include both EI Service Coordination and EI services. A Primary Service Provider is identified by using the Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) process and is carefully selected to best meet the needs of the child and family to help accomplish their outcome(s).
