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### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

I am pleased to share that the Clinton County Board of Developmental Disabilities fully supports the Blue Envelope Program. This is a program that was introduced in Mahoning County but has since been spearheaded by a group of self-advocates in southern Ohio. Marnie Reed, our local Family Support Liaison, has met with our local law enforcement and first responder personnel to educate them on the program and seek their buy-in to ensure a successful launch right here in Clinton County. We are already finding great success locally.

So what is Ohio's Blue Envelope Program? The Blue Envelope Program provides individuals with disabilities a Blue Envelope decal for their vehicle and a Blue Envelope to provide to law enforcement or other community service personnel during a traffic stop or accident. The Blue Envelope may contain the individual's identification, contact information, medical information, instructions regarding communication preferences, or pertinent vehicle operating documents such as the vehicle registration and proof of insurance. The Blue Envelope decal, as well as these documents, tell the responding deputy or officer that an individual in that vehicle has a condition or disability requiring additional accommodations

#### **Annual Training**

Reminder for all direct support professionals (DSPs), independent providers, directors of operations, and administrators of licensed residential facilities to complete their required annual training for the 2025 calendar year by **December 31**, **2025**.

Review the rules to ensure you meet all training requirements:

- Agency provider certification rule: OAC 5123-2-08
- · Independent provider certification rule: OAC 5123-2-09
- · Licensed residential facilities administration: OAC 5123-3-01

## SOCIAL SECURITY

Why is it important for workers with disabilities to have a my Social Security account?

## • Apply for SSI/SSDI benefits

- ✓ Check your application or appeal status
- ✓ View the estimated decision date or any missing information
- ✓ Access notices and letters online no need to wait for the mail

#### Track your work earnings credits

- ✓ Check that your wages are reported correctly each year
- ✓ Mistakes in your earning record can cause benefit delays or lower payments later
- ✓ You can review your income history anytime and request corrections if needed

### • Monitor your disability benefits

- ✓ View your current benefit amount and payment history
- ✓ Check deposit Dates and make sure your payments are accurate
- ✓ Keep track of changes if you're working while receiving SSI or SSDI

### Report work and wage changes

- ✓ Report your job updates or pay changes quickly online
- ✓ Helps prevent overpayments
- ✓ Makes it easier to follow Social Security work reporting rules

## • Plan for your future

- ✓ View estimates for retirement, disability, and survivor benefits
- ✓ Understand how your work earnings may affect your future benefits
- ✓ Stay informed about your financial options as your situation changes

During the government shut down, Social Security offices are open but not all services are available. In addition to the reasons listed above, you can use your *my* Social Security account to request replacement Social Security or Medicaid cards, set up or change your direct deposit, and more.

The government shutdown will not affect benefit payments. They will continue without interruption, on time, and with no changes to payment dates.
