When can I get my COVID-19 vaccine? Ohioans eligible

- ✓ Age 65+
- ✓ Those with intellectual or developmental disorders listed in the Priority Populations Fact Sheet.
- ✓ Employees of K-12 schools
- Ohioans born with or who have early childhood conditions that are carried into adulthood, which put them at a higher risk for adverse outcomes due to COVID-19, may choose to receive the vaccine at the provider of their choice, but will be asked by their vaccine provider to confirm that they are, in fact, eligible at this time.

TALKING POINTS FOR YOU

- COVID-19 vaccines are scarce, and we must be patient while demand for the vaccine remains higher than the available supply. As vaccine supply increases, more and more Ohioans in Phase 1B will be able to be vaccinated. Eventually, as vaccine becomes widely available, all Ohioans who choose to be vaccinated will be able to receive COVID-19 vaccines.
- Right now, the vaccine supply in Ohio and across the country is limited. Keep yourself safe and keep businesses open by masking up, backing up, washing up, and avoiding crowds.
- We're seeing case numbers drop and that's great news. What we can't afford to do is let our guard down now. Stay vigilant so we can get back to normal sooner.
- There is a lot of false information about the vaccine and COVID-19 online. I encourage you to seek out information from a variety of reputable sources and make the best decisions for you and your family based on facts not fiction.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- ✓ Set a good example, by wearing a mask, making virtual accommodations, and maintaining social distance when meeting face-to-face with others.
- ✓ Post on social media to describe how you are working to keep your congregation and those you interact with safe (and what they can do to help you maintain a safe environment) using the suggested hashtags.
- \checkmark Submit letters to the editor or local news outlets that support the "COVID-19 Key Messages;" wear a mask, wash hands often, and social distance.
- \checkmark Participate in local media/radio interviews to support "COVID-19 Key Messages," and help showcase how you and your colleagues are helping Ohio continue on the road to recovery.
