COVID-19 UPDATES

Decrease in Hospitalizations: Ohio continues to see downward COVID-19 hospitalization trends, particularly in the 80+ age group which was among the first groups to become eligible for the vaccine. In December, those 80+ made up more than 25% of Ohio's COVID hospitalizations. This month, that number has dropped to about 18%.

Provider Expansion: Ohio is expected to receive 310,000 first doses of vaccine next week. With this increase in vaccine doses, Ohio will expand the number of providers administering the vaccine to include additional independent pharmacies and some Meijer and Walmart locations. Providers currently receiving vaccines can expect to see an increase in their allotted doses. Find vaccine providers at <u>vaccine.coronavirus.ohio.gov</u>.

Sporting/Entertainment Venues: Governor DeWine announced <u>capacity</u> <u>changes</u> for sporting and entertainment locations. These venues can reopen with 25% maximum indoor capacity and 30% maximum outdoor capacity.

Nursing Home Compassionate Care: Compassionate care visits at nursing homes are permitted regardless of coronavirus spread. If anyone in your community is having trouble scheduling a compassionate care visit, contact the Long-Term Care Ombudsman at 800-282-1206 or OhioOmbudsman@age.ohio.gov

TALKING POINTS FOR YOU

■ COVID-19 vaccines are scarce, and we must be patient while demand for the vaccine remains higher than the available supply. As vaccine supply increases, more and more Ohioans in Phase 1B will be able to be vaccinated. Eventually, as vaccine becomes widely available, all Ohioans who choose to be vaccinated will be able to receive COVID-19 vaccines.

■ Keep yourself safe and keep businesses open by masking up, backing up, washing up, and avoiding crowds.

■ Whether you hear myths on social media, at work, or from friends or family, there is a lot of dangerous misinformation out there about COVID-19 vaccines. The truth is that COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, and rigorously tested.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

 \checkmark Set a good example, by wearing a mask, making virtual accommodations, and maintaining social distance when meeting face-to-face with others.

 \checkmark Post on social media to describe how you are working to keep your employees and customers safe (and what they can do to help you maintain a safe environment) using the suggested hashtags.

 \checkmark Submit letters to the editor or local news outlets that support the "COVID-19 Key Messages;" wear a mask, wash hands often, and social distance.
