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This is Our Earth – This activity is for the Pre-K students (5-year-olds). We look at different places on the earth, like mountains, oceans, deserts, farms and cities. Then we see how litter just doesn't belong in any of those places. We discuss the benefits of recycling and show examples of the proper household recyclables. Students then help separate recyclables from the trash. Each student receives a coloring book about recycling. Allow 30 minutes.
